WHEREAS, novelty lighters have features which are attractive to children, including visual effects, flashing lights, musical sounds and toylike designs, making it difficult to distinguish between a toy and a fire tool; and


WHEREAS, the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission has recalled thousands of novelty lighters due to the danger posed to public safety; and


