Tibshrary Honored for Service to NCEES

At its August 2009 annual meeting, NCEES presented the Distinguished Service Award to Mitchell Tibshrary Jr., P.E., of Columbia, S.C., for his dedicated service to the engineering and surveying professions. A member of the South Carolina State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Surveyors from 1996 to 2008, Tibshrary served as board chair, vice chair and secretary during his tenure. While on the Board, he was instrumental in decisions on budgets, policy and enforcement issues, and

he worked to ensure Board representation at zone and national meetings and on NCEES committees. He also promoted faculty licensure and spoke to university students about the value of licensure. He is now an emeritus member of the South Carolina Board. Tibshrary served as the 2005–07 Southern Zone vice president. He was a member of the Advisory Committee on Council Activities for four terms and served as a member of the Committee on Awards, the Mobility Task Force, and the Special Awards Task Force. In May 2009, Tibshrary was awarded the Southern Zone Distinguished Service Award. Tibshrary has been a member of the South Carolina Society of Professional Engineers since 1973 and is as a past president of the organization's Columbia chapter. He is a former chair of the South Carolina Joint Engineers Council and a past president of the Columbia and South Carolina sections of IEEE.

NCEES Approves New PE Exam in Software Engineering

The NCEES Board of Directors has approved the development of a new PE exam for software engineers. The decision came during the Board's August 11 meeting in Louisville, Ky., in conjunction with the organization's annual business meeting.

A study of professional activities and knowledge is the initial step of the exam development process. The study will include a survey of a diverse sample of software engineering professionals to gather information about the relative importance of various areas of knowledge within the discipline as they relate to the protection of the public welfare. This information will be used to determine the topics covered in the exam. After the survey is complete, exam items will be written for the initial exam administration. After that, the exam will be administered yearly.

Partnering with NCEES as co-sponsor of the exam is IEEE-USA, which will be assisted by the IEEE Computer Society, the National Society of Professional Engineers and the Texas Board of Professional Engineers.

Groups representing software engineers have long maintained that software engineering should be licensed because it is increasingly practiced in areas that reach into the everyday lives of the general public, such as traffic control systems and the electrical grid. An IEEE Computer Society survey of software engineers indicated that two-thirds of those employed in the industry support a licensure exam for their profession.

Prior to the approval of the software exam, the most recent PE exam to be added to the NCEES exam offerings is the architectural engineering exam, first administered in 2002.

NCEES Continues to Address Additional Education Requirement



At its 2009 annual meeting in Louisville, NCEES delegates continued to address issues related to the additional education requirement for engineering licensure that, upon adoption by any specific state-level jurisdiction, could go into effect as early as 2020.

The additional education requirement now calls for an engineering licensure

candidate to obtain a master's degree or its equivalent prior to taking the PE exam, which is typically the final step in the engineering licensure process. The first such language was approved for addition to the *Model Law* by Council vote in 2006. Over the past three years, several additions and modifications to the language were approved to adjust and clarify the requirement. Before 2006, NCEES *Model Law* required only an engineering bachelor's degree from an EAC/ABET-accredited program.

At this year's meeting, delegates passed a resolution calling for the Engineering Education Task Force to study alternatives to the master's or equivalent requirement, including an alternative to "reform the bachelor's degree program" to incorporate into undergraduate engineering degrees "the appropriate education requirements to practice at a professional level."

Later in the business session, the Council approved a motion presented by the Engineering Education Task Force to move forward with developing a clearinghouse for evaluating candidates' education qualifications. The clearinghouse would be used when a candidate does not have a master's degree but presents additional education for consideration as being equivalent to a master's degree. In explaining the rationale for proposing such a clearinghouse, Task Force Chair Michael Konzett, P.E., of Nebraska said the clearinghouse would allow for consistency across NCEES member licensing boards in interpreting the "or equivalent" clause of the master's or equivalent requirement. The Council also formally incorporated into the *Model Law* language that further clarifies the master's or equivalent requirement.

"Judging from its actions at the annual meeting, the Council expressed its will to continue with the effort to strengthen the educational qualification for licensure but also to continue the dialogue with all concerned parties," Executive Director Jerry Carter said. "It is clear that the Council members want to ensure that other feasible alternatives are investigated. I look forward to seeing how this process unfolds as NCEES works to build consensus on this important issue."

The Portfolio Process: Alternate Licensure Procedure for Professional Engineers

In June 2007, the South Carolina legislature approved a process for licensure of individuals who hold an engineering technology degree. The "portfolio process" is open until June 30, 2020. As of September 30, 2009, the Board has licensed 25 individuals, and approximately 43 more have been approved to begin the portfolio process.

The portfolio process allows technology graduates to demonstrate their experience through submittal of a portfolio of three projects. Portfolios are reviewed by committees comprised of engineers and professors in that specific discipline; upon acceptance of the portfolio, the applicant is invited for an interview. The committee makes a recommendation to the Board regarding licensure, and the Board then votes on the application.

The Board needs more reviewers for the Portfolio committees!! If you are interested in serving on a committee, contact [Melissa Jones](#). Licensure is required of the practitioners, but professors are not required to be licensed. Professional development credit is given for the time spent in meetings.

Board Approves Distribution of Education and Research Funds



The Board approved funding for the following events between July 1, 2008, and June 30, 2009:

\$2,000 to the S.C. Society of Professional Engineers for speakers at the organization's ASCE/SCSPE Winter Meeting.

\$3,000 to the S.C. Society of Professional Land Surveyors for speakers at the organization's annual conference.

\$12,000 to three professional organizations that co-sponsored the S.C. Engineering Conference and Trade Show: The American Council of Engineering Companies of South Carolina, The American Society of Civil Engineers (S.C.), and the S.C. Society of Professional Engineers.

Section 40-22-255 gives the Board authority to designate up to \$10 from each renewal fee for research and education purposes. The funding approved is for specified activities or speakers, as requested by the organizations, and has provided opportunities for more speakers than the organizations could fund on their own, thereby increasing continuing education opportunities to licensees. Funding is not limited to speakers, however. At the request of the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE SC), the Board approved \$5,000 to offset some of the expenses of an exam review course, sponsored by the organization, to include space, instructor fees and course materials. The funding will increase access to the review course for individuals seeking licensure as professional engineers in South Carolina. In its request, the Society stated, "We believe that professional registration is a critical step in ones career development." The course is web-based, taught by experienced instructors, and is offered as a series of 12 two-hour modules held simultaneously in Charleston, Columbia and Greenville over a six-week period.

Four-year Degrees for Surveying Being offered in South Carolina

With the implementation of the four-year degree requirement for licensure as a Surveyor, it is good news that two universities have adopted curricula that meet the education requirement. Clemson University and South Carolina State University have proposed curricula to the Board that will meet four-year education requirements for licensure as a surveyor, and the Board has officially approved the degrees for licensure purposes. (This approval should not be confused with ABET accreditation, as that designation is determined by the EAC Commission of ABET.) It is, however, an assurance to individuals who wish to undertake the coursework that the curriculum is acceptable to the Board. Please contact the engineering departments at Clemson and at S.C. State University for additional information.

Deadline for Applying for Surveyors License with a two-year degree



Until June 30, 2010, applicants with a two-year degree and required survey coursework may still apply to take the Professional Surveying exam. **Applicants must have satisfied the education and experience requirements and must have submitted a complete application to this Board by June 30, 2010, in order to be eligible to take the exam.** If an applicant meets education and experience requirements and is approved by the Board, he/she may take the exam

AFTER June 30, 2010, and may continue to take the exam according to previously-set rules regarding frequency of exams taken (e.g., the applicant might need to do further study after two or more failing grades). All requirements must have been completed by June 30, 2010. **Under no circumstances will the Board be able to accept applications filed after the deadline from individuals who hold a two-year degree.**

For example, if an applicant will not have the required years of experience until August 1, 2010, he/she will be required to meet the 4-year-degree requirement. If an applicant will have the required years of experience by June 20, 2010, he/she must complete the forms, have them signed, and submit them to the Board for receipt by June 30, 2010, in order to be eligible to take the PS exam under the 2-year-degree provision.

Education Requirements Will change for Surveyor Licensure

After July 1, 2010, surveyors applying for licensure by examination in South Carolina will be required to have a 4-year degree to meet the education requirement. Statute 40-22-225(C) states that the minimum qualifications for licensure as a Tier A Professional Surveyor, after July 1, 2010, will be “graduation from a school or college of four or more years with a Board-approved degree, an ABET commission accredited curriculum in a related field, or a substantially equivalent program, including completed discipline-specific courses of not less than 12 semester hours or the equivalent in quarter hours satisfactory to the Board in each of the disciplines described in Section 40-22-20(24) for which the applicant is requesting licensure.....” This education requirement has been “in the works” for years, but the implementation date was set for 2010 to allow ample time for individuals to complete a two-year degree and obtain required surveying courses for licensure by June 30, 2010, if they did not wish to obtain the four-year degree.

Some applicants will take the Fundamentals of Surveying exam in April 2010 and will not know if they passed until June. In this situation, applicants should submit the application and all documentation by June 30, 2010, even if the FS scores have not been distributed. If the applicant passes the FS exam, he/she will be considered for eligibility to take the Professional Surveyor exam in October 2010, or later, if the completed application is filed with the Board office no later than 5 p.m. on June 30, 2010.

The requirements for certification as a surveyor-in-training and for licensure as a Professional Surveyor are in Section 40-22-225 of the statutes.
